

Planned Giving Program

The Planned Giving Program is an opportunity for Parishioners to commit to donating funds to their Parish at regular intervals. It is the primary source of income for a Parish. Typically, donations are made on a weekly basis, with envelopes being taken up in the second collection of weekend Masses (The first collection supports our Priests, and the upkeep of the Presbytery). New envelopes are issued annually, however Parishioners may opt to join the program at any time during the year. Direct debiting is another option as well as bi-weekly, monthly, or yearly contributions.

Just like a household, or a business, the Parish has many expenses to meet throughout the year. It must cover payments for items such as insurance, electricity, telephones, maintenance, repairs, rates and hygiene. The Planned Giving Program, therefore, is essential as it allows the Parish to budget, and with some certainty know that it can pay expenses that fall due during the year. It also enables the Parish to plan for, and prioritise, specific projects, and highlight where expenditure may need to be deferred or further fundraising undertaken (in case of special needs).



Pope Francis' Prayer for the Year of Mercy

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him. Show us your face and we will be saved.

You are the visible face of the invisible
Father, of the God who manifests his power above
all by forgiveness and mercy: let the Church be
your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and
glorified. You willed that your ministers would also
be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel
compassion for those in ignorance and error: let
everyone who approaches them feel sought after,
loved, and forgiven by God.

Send your Spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind. We ask this through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy, you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. **Amen.**

THE YEAR OF MERCY

What an opportunity Pope Francis has given us in the Year of Mercy! As Catholics it is a chance to rediscover and put forth the best of who we are. The year is, of course, an inclusive year for all, and the Pope wants all to be involved. The Year of Mercy began when Pope Francis opened the Door of Mercy (8th December, 2015 - 20th November, 2016).

What is the significance of "opening the door of Mercy" you might ask?

In everyday life we walk through many doors, without recognising that is what we are doing. In the doors that are part of our lives, we might ask, "what is the spirit of hospitality we offer to those who knock. Are we welcoming and gracious, so that the one who knocks feels welcomed and loved? Or do we first check who it might be and even then refuse to open the door?"

And what of the door of our hearts?

Can we be at home with ourselves and can we sit a while in this space of grace? Do we come face to face with a gratuitous God of mercy who welcomes us unconditionally?

During this time the Holy Father calls the whole Church to grow deeper in awareness of the Father's merciful and forgiving love, a love that sets us free to be who we are called to be as sons and daughters of God and to bring that mercy to the world. In his book 'The Church of Mercy' Pope Francis tells us "it is not simply enough to open the (church) door in welcome ... But we must go out through that door to seek and meet the people."

Mercy is the most radical of messages in a world where the survival of the fittest and the most unforgiving is the order of the day.

Mercy calls for the virtue of humility, for we who know our salvation depends on God's Mercy to our families, our community, our nation. Mercy goes beyond justice and without mercy justice is not complete.

Pope Francis said that "The spiritual and corporal works of Mercy must never be separated". There are endless small works of mercy we can show to each other, and to strangers who cross our path. Those who are unable to be active, as they once were, can also be involved.

Reflect on these words from a poem by Mary Wickham entitled:

The Door of Mercy The door of Mercy. is double-hinged, swinging in, opening out, sturdy, yet easily moved.

My friends says: you have only to knock once, and you only have to knock lightly ...

Mostly the Door of Mercy stands ajar, in spirit and in flesh you cross it's threshold each day, often unmindful, but sometimes, and increasingly, amazed at its potent familiarity...

It is not immediately apparent which side is which of the Door of Mercy, since they interchange fluidly, pain and promise etched sharply on both.

Blessing is for all who come and go, stay and return, helper and helped, all belonging, each bestowing...

The Door of Mercy, whose door it is, is always home.

As we do not want this year of Mercy to be only inwardly centered, you are invited to pray for the desperate people in Syria who are dying of hunger and malnutrition, including children, and for the numbers of those who have died at sea trying to cross on their way to reach a safe destination. Let us pray that survivors will find a welcome and not a closed boarder.

Soon there will be another insert to let you know what "The Year of Mercy Committee" has planned for our Community to help us enter more fully into the Year of Mercy.
