ST FRANCIS AND THE MERCY OF GOD Our Diocesan Heritage

THE HOLY YEAR OF MERCY - SACRED HEART PARISH INVERELL - AUGUST 2016

It is remarkable how little we really know about the deep spiritual lives of our Armidale diocesan bishops. With **Bishop Elzear Torreggiani**, however, our second bishop (from 1879 to 1904), we can be sure that his commitment to life as a Capuchin-Franciscan friar shaped his spirituality profoundly. His remarkable simplicity, gentleness, humility, friendliness and his strong and tireless sense of mission, are all Franciscan spiritual traits.

On his way to Australia from England via Italy, the new bishop visited the new Pope, Leo XIII (1878-1903). The Pope had been bishop of Perugia in central Italy, a see that included Assisi, the hometown of St Francis. He was deeply committed to promoting Franciscan life and he believed that lay (or Third Order) Franciscans could make a special difference in the world. This was already happening in Europe. Frederic Ozanam (1813-53), for instance, the founder with others of the St Vincent de Paul Society in France, was a lay Franciscan. So Pope Leo encouraged Bishop Torreggiani to organise lay Franciscan groups in his new diocese in far-away Australia. The bishop did so, and Inverell and Glen Innes in particular became thriving centres of lay Franciscan activity during Bishop Torreggiani's time.

The Franciscan commitment of Bishop Torreggiani and his Capuchin confreres has left us a tangible legacy in the churches dedicated to **Our Lady (or St Mary) of the Angels** in the diocese: in Bundarra (where the bishop loved to take a break), Guyra, Rowena, and the chapel of the former Ursuline Convent in Armidale. Our Lady of the Angels was the patroness of the very small chapel on the plain below the mountain-side town of Assisi. It was given to St Francis by the local Benedictines for the annual rent of a basket of fish. It became the "Little Portion" (Italian *Porziuncula*) for Francis. He loved it dearly and he made it the headquarters for the annual fathering of his new religious Order, the Lesser Brothers of Penance, whom we know now as Franciscans. From this place Francis sent his Brothers out on mission to the world to announce the mercy and goodness of God. Here the Poor Man of Assisi died, lying stripped on the floor, surrounded by his Brothers, who sang to him and read the Passion from John's Gospel as he was passing to God. The chapel still stands and is housed today in the Basilica of Our Lady of the Angels.

Misericordia, mercy, was a word of special significance to St Francis. It occurs throughout his writings and is a basic feature of his thinking and his way of life. St Francis asked Our Lady of the Angels and Our Lord for the special privilege known as the Pardon (*Perdono* in Italian) of Assisi, an understanding that anyone who visited the chapel and prayed with sincerity and sorrow, would be pardoned for their sins. He wanted everyone to go to heaven. This year marks 800 years since that Pardon was granted to St Francis at Our Lady of the Angels in 1216. Franciscans all over the world are celebrating the anniversary (http://www.ofm.org/ofm/?p=11184&lang=en). On **Thursday 4 August**, Pope Francis will visit Our Lady of the Angels in Assisi as part of the schedule of events for this Holy Year of Mercy, remembering the special grace of the *Perdono*. We can join in the occasion in spirit, recalling how confident St Francis was that our God of love and mercy would grant us forgiveness if we approached him humbly.

August 2 (Tuesday) is the feast of Our Lady of the Angels. We can make it a day of special gratitude to God for the gift of our Franciscan heritage in the diocese through Bishop Torreggiani and his Capuchin confreres who served our rural church so well into the early years of the 20th century. The Pardon of Assisi, part of that heritage, shows us another radiant face of our merciful God and another facet of the jewel-like beauty of Mary, the Mother of Our Lord, whom St Francis loved so deeply.

"Let all things their Creator bless!"

St Francis is renowned for his tender love for all created things and especially for animals and birds. Everyone knows the story of how the saint tamed the ravenous wolf of Gubbio and established an agreement between the animal and the citizens to their mutual advantage. Francis told everyone to be sure to give extra feed to birds and animals on great feast-days, but at Christmastime particularly, in honour of God becoming part of our created world in Jesus, the Beloved Son. Our modern sensitivity to cruelty to animals did not exist in the medieval period, and society has struggled with showing kindness to animals in every age since the time of St Francis. The RSPCA, focused on animal care, emerged in the 19th century through the work of a clergyman, Reverend Arthur Broome (1779-1837). He formed a Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals in London in 1824 (hpps://animalsmattertogod.com/2012/06/16/reverend-arthur-broome ...). Christian living should be marked by deep consideration for animal welfare. The tradition of blessing the animals on or about the annual feast of St Francis (4 October) is something we could consider for St Francis Church in Tingha. Monsignor Wilkes, a local Inverell farm boy, used to hold this ceremony in Armidale when he was at the Cathedral. Tingha is special, with its cattle free to roam on the common between the grids. Pets can be included in the gathering for a blessing. We can read the Genesis story of our creating God. St Francis's Canticle of the Creatures and psalms honouring the Creator can be sung. We can tell stories of what animals, birds, fish – and trees and plants - mean to us individually and how they bring us closer to the wonder of our God. Perhaps the blessing of the animals could be part of our Catholic community or Christian ecumenical contribution to the annual Inverell Sapphire City Festival in October. Or maybe part of a Festival of St Francis with a pilgrimage to Tingha over the October long weekend.

St Francis believed that the God of infinite mercy had come into his life when God moved him to embrace a leper on the road below Assisi, something he felt he could never do before. He saw God's mercy in his life when the crucified Lord spoke to him from the Cross in the chapel of San Damiano, just below Assisi, giving direction to his life: "Francis, go and repair my church which you see is everywhere falling into ruins." All this happened in a rural setting. It should give us great hope that the God of mercy will also come into our own lives in country Australia, here and now, in Inverell, Tingha, Ashford. The Lord of all goodness sent us Bishop Torreggiani and his Capuchin-Franciscans as a great act of mercy. We must always treasure that heritage of Franciscan spirituality they brought us, putting us in close touch with the divine mercy seen in the life of St Francis, and try to recover it as part of our celebration of 150 years as a parish in 2018.

Our pastor, Father Roel, was ordained to the priesthood in a church with St Francis as patron in the Philippines. Perhaps our Tingha St Francis church can become our very own local "Little Portion," our *Porziuncula*, a pilgrimage centre, with a San Damiano Cross placed there, calling our young people especially to generously serve our Lord and his people in the Church, the community of mercy.


