As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father,


so whoever eats me will draw life from me.

Reflections Gospel

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRISTI (CORPUS CHRISTI) / A

THE GIFT PAR EXCELLENCE

When Iesus ascended on high, he gave gifts to his followers. To the community of believers, he gave some people as apostles, and others as prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers (Eph 4:8, 11). But the greatest gift that Jesus gave is his very self. This is made possible through the sacrament of the Eucharist which we celebrate with solemnity in today's feast of Corpus Christi. Saint John Paul II points this out: 'The Church has received the Eucharist from Christ her Lord not as one gift however precious among so many others, but as the gift par excellence, for it is the gift of himself, of his person in his sacred humanity, as well as the gift of his saving work' (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, 11).

Today's Gospel speaks of the mystery of Jesus' person. When Jesus declared, 'My flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink', many in the crowd, including some of his disciples, could not accept that he was from God, the bread come down from heaven. Peter, however, expresses his faith (on behalf of the believing disciples and the Church throughout history): 'Lord, to whom shall we go? You have t message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God' (Jn 6:68).

The Eucharist is indeed a mystery that demands faith. The sacrifice of Christ and sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice... It is a sacrifice of praise in thanksgiving for the work of creation... it is also the memorial of Christ's Passover, and the making present and the sacramental offering of his unique sacrifice, in the liturgy of the Church which is his Body' (CCC no. 1359, 1362, 1367). The whole Church together with Christ enters into the hidden mystery and anticipates the heavenly banquet.
