

First World Day for Grandparents & the Elderly - 25 July "I am with you always". This weekend we start our Marriage & Family Week by praying particularly for the grandparents and elderly in our parish and around the world. Old age is a blessing from God. We should never be afraid of ageing. Christians have a responsibility to show kindness, respect, love, and to take care of the elderly. We thank all the grandparents and elderly members of our parish who have helped keep the faith alive here in the Inverell community. God love you.

Reflection As a grain of wheat slowly multiplies in the ground, so the bread and fishes, by a Divinely hastened process were multiplied until everyone had his fill. If [Jesus] had given money, no one would have had his fill. Nature was to go as far as it could, then God supplied the rest. He ordered that the fragments be gathered up; they filled twelve baskets. In the reckoning of men there is always a deficit; in the arithmetic of God, there is always a surplus. The effect of the miracle on the multitude was stupendous. There was no denying the fact that Christ had Divine power. He showed it in multiplying the bread. It brought their minds back immediately to Moses, who had given their forefathers manna in the desert. And had not Moses said that he was the prefigure of Christ or the Messiah? If Moses had authenticated or sealed himself by bread in the desert, was not This the One to Whom Moses had pointed, since He too gave bread miraculously? Who, then, could be a better King for them to throw off the yoke of the Romans and make them free? But the Reader of hearts knew how worldly were their ambitions for Him. They could not make Him King: He was born a King. His Kingship would come through the Divine "must" of the Cross, and not through popular force. The crowd would push Him to a throne. He said He would not be pushed; He would be "lifted up" to it and the throne would be the Cross, and His Kingship would be over hearts. Venerable Servant of God, Archbishop Fulton J Sheen
